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You can use audit logs to monitor the activities and commands of users on the Application Server. The **psacct** utility provides audit log functions. It contains four commands: ac, lastcomm, accton, and sa.

Follow these steps to enable a login audit on the Application Server:

Procedure

1. Go to the operating system login page.
2. Log in as the user called **root**.
3. Enter the password associated with this username.
The system displays the operating system desktop.
4. Choose **Application > System Tools > Terminal**.
The system displays the command line.
5. Follow the instructions in the table.
